

**GLEN OSBORNE BOROUGH
MINUTES
JULY 19, 2022
COUNCIL MEETING**

CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of Glen Osborne Borough Council was held in Osborne Elementary School, on Tuesday, July 19, 2022. President Thomas Huddleston called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

APPROVAL OF JUNE 21, 2022 COUNCIL MINUTES

A motion was made by Jim Cohen, seconded by Mary Scalercio, to approve the Council Meeting Minutes. Council voted 5 – 0 to approve the Minutes.

APPROVAL OF JULY 11, 2022 COMMITTEE MINUTES

A motion was made by Jim Cohen, seconded by Mary Scalercio, to approve the Committee Meeting Minutes. Council voted 5 – 0 to approve the Minutes.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Carrier reviewed the police report for the month of June which included police coverage of traffic control at school, and an incident where a train was stopped and blocked the railroad crossing at the Haysville light intersection for over an hour.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

The Borough received \$1,078 Real Estate Transfer Tax from Allegheny County for the month of June from the sale of 1105 Ohio River Boulevard.

A payment of \$635 was received from Magistrate Ford's District Court for the month of June.

PUBLIC SERVICES

Mary Scalercio reported that that eleven orders have been received for military banners. Bill Monski will continue to coordinate the program and the eventual placement of banners along Beaver Road.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Jim Cohen reviewed Borough Engineer Clint Reilly's projected cost of \$35,000 to repaint all the Borough's crosswalks and yellow lines, using the proper paints. Due to the high cost, Council will include this project during preparation of the 2023 Budget.

On motion of Jim Cohen, seconded by Bill Monski, Council voted 5 – 0, to have John Wick replace old street signs with new signs, at a cost of up to \$3,000.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT

Solicitor Stone submitted a draft of the amended parking ordinance for Council to review.

PUBLIC WORKS

The Glen Osborne Self Storage contract was executed and will be paid every 6 months.

At a cost of \$54,200, storm sewer repair work at 1468 Beaver Road is scheduled to begin during the last week of July and should be completed before school begins.

It was recommended that NIRA assist with updating our GIS map. This project will include an interactive web-based map of the Borough's infrastructure.


BILLS
