

**GLEN OSBORNE BOROUGH
MINUTES
AUGUST 16, 2022
COUNCIL MEETING**

CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of Glen Osborne Borough Council was held in Osborne Elementary School, on Tuesday, August 16, 2022. President Thomas Huddleston called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

President Huddleston welcomed NIRA Engineers' GIS Manager Ed Bosenberg. Mr. Bosenberg reviewed his proposal for GIS improvements and updates. The Borough's sanitary sewers, storm sewers and paving history would be included. Council will take the proposal under advisement and will make a decision in the near future.

APPROVAL OF JULY 19, 2022 COUNCIL MINUTES

A motion was made by Bill Monski, seconded by John Orndorff, to approve the Council Meeting Minutes. Council voted 5 – 0 to approve the Minutes.

APPROVAL OF AUGUST 1, 2022 COMMITTEE MINUTES

A motion was made by Bill Monski, seconded by John Orndorff, to approve the Committee Meeting Minutes. Council voted 5 – 0 to approve the Minutes.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Carrier reviewed the police report for the month of July which included a fatal traffic accident along Ohio River Boulevard at the Haysville light intersection.

On motion of Barbara Carrier, seconded by Holly Merriman, Council voted 5 – 0 to donate \$1,000 from the Mayor's Fund to Sewickley's Light Up Night.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

The Borough received \$760 Real Estate Transfer Tax from Allegheny County for the month of July from the sale of 1508 Railroad Avenue.

A payment of \$275 was received from Magistrate Ford's District Court for the month of July.

During the month of August Allegheny County Health Department is distributing rabies vaccine baits for wild raccoons throughout Allegheny County. Over the past 21 years this program has significantly reduced human and pet exposure to rabies.

PUBLIC SERVICES

Bill Monski reported that thirteen military banner flags should be ready by the end of the week. Bill Monski will coordinate the placement of military banner flags along Beaver Road.

PUBLIC WORKS

John Orndorff reported that the storm sewer repair work at 1468 Beaver Road is scheduled to begin next week.

McKown Lane and the north bound portion of Glen Mitchell Road are in need of repaving. John Orndorff will review the condition of other borough roads and ask Clint Reilly to obtain estimates, so the costs can be considered in the 2023 budget.


BILLS

ZONING

President Huddleston advised the need for a comprehensive update and requested that Carolyn Yagle and Laura Ludwig attend the September 6th Committee Meeting to discuss their proposals. Council requested that Clint Reilly attend this meeting, too.

There being no further business, on motion of Anne Fruehauf, seconded by Bill Monski, Council voted unanimously to adjourn at 9:12 p.m.
