

**GLEN OSBORNE BOROUGH
MINUTES
FEBRUARY 17, 2026
COUNCIL MEETING**

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting of Glen Osborne Borough Council was held in Osborne Elementary School, on Tuesday, February 17, 2026. President John Orndorff called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

President Orndorff welcomed Jennifer Coyne who submitted her affidavit of residency.

APPROVAL OF JANUARY 20, 2026 COUNCIL MINUTES

A motion was made by Bill Monski, seconded by Greg Curran, to approve the Council Meeting Minutes. Council voted 5 – 0, to approve the Minutes.

APPROVAL OF FEBRUARY 5, 2026 COMMITTEE MINUTES

A motion was made by Bill Monski, seconded by Greg Curran to approve the Committee Meeting Minutes. Council voted 5 – 0, to approve the Minutes.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Diane Vierling reported that Borough Engineer Clint Reilly approved the completed Inlet Replacement and Sanitary Sewer Rehab Project. The Borough received a **2024-GEDTF-279** grant of \$100,000 for this project. The total cost of the project is \$161,484.80. The Borough is responsible for \$61,484.80. \$49,000 was included in the Borough's 2026 Budget for this project. Diane Vierling obtained approval from PennDot Municipal Service's Supervisor Timothy Tagmyer for the Borough to use Liquid Fuels funds for stormwater inlet replacement expenses of the Inlet Replacement and Sanitary Sewer Rehab Project. On motion of Josh Lambert seconded by Jim Cohen, Council voted 5 – 0, to pay the Borough's \$61,484.80 portion of the Inlet Replacement and Sanitary Sewer Rehab Project, using \$49,000 general funds and \$14,484.80 Liquid Fuels funds.

The Borough received \$46 from Magistrate Rosselli office for fines for the month of January.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT

Anne Fruehauf moved to Edgeworth Borough which created a vacancy to fill her former position on Council for two years, until December 31, 2027.

President Orndorff opened for floor for nominations to fill the vacancy created by Anne Fruehauf's departure from Council. Bill Monski nominated Jennifer Coyne. John Orndorff seconded the nomination. There were no other nominations. Council was polled, and all voted yes to approve the nomination.

Mayor Doeblen administered the Oath of Office to Jennifer Coyne for member of Council.

Solicitor Jewart provided an overview of a preservation letter received by the Borough and the Council members.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Jim Cohen described options he is exploring for replacing the Borough's three damaged "State Law Stop for Pedestrians Crosswalk Signs". The signs are over 12 years old. One new sign will be ordered. The other two signs might be able to be repaired by having the panels replaced.

Pothole season has arrived. John Orndorff will notify Brian Brown and advise him to patch the potholes with cold patch.

PUBLIC SERVICES

Josh Lambert commented that the new website is nearly ready to go live. On motion of Josh Lambert, seconded by Jim Cohen, Council voted 6 – 0, to authorize Solicitor Jewart to prepare and send a letter of intent to terminate the agreement with our current website provider.

PUBLIC WORKS

President Orndorff reported that Brian Brown removed "Zach Spark's Bench" located at 1008 Beaver Road, as requested by the owners of the property George and Jodi Hackett.

Jennifer Coyne and John Orndorff met with Clint Reilly to discuss developing a “River Road Quiet Zone”. Jennifer Coyne is scheduled to meet with a representative of a member of Norfolk Southern’s public affairs committee and liaison with the community. Collaboration with the Norfolk Southern Railroad is essential to move forward with this project.

At 7:48 p.m. Representative Valerie Gaydos arrived and introduced her staff assistant Carson Cramer. Bill Monski thanked Representative Gaydos for her support of the Allegheny Health Network and Heritage Valley Health System merger. Diane Vierling thanked Representative Gaydos for her support and assistance helping the Borough obtain the GEDTF grant for the recently completed Inlet Replacement and Sanitary Sewer Rehab Project.

Solicitor Jewart is going to review the right of way for the property at the Davis Run Bridge.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

Bill Monski will receive information about the status of the County’s Hazard Mitigation plan at the March 2nd E.M.C. meeting.


FINANCE & BILLS
