

**GLEN OSBORNE BOROUGH
MINUTES
MARCH 17, 2026
COUNCIL MEETING**

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting of Glen Osborne Borough Council was held in Osborne Elementary School, on Tuesday, March 17, 2026. President John Orndorff called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

President Orndorff welcomed Glen Osborne residents Moya Kenny and Mr. & Mrs. Zeffiro. Ms. Kenny was concerned about a citation she received. Solicitor's representative, Alex Giorgetti, explained that Council could not make comments regarding code enforcement citations, and she needed to follow the instructions she received from the Magistrate's office.

Mr. & Mrs. Zeffiro expressed their concerns regarding the stone wall along Route 65 and powerlines and dangerous trees overhanging Ohio River Boulevard. Mrs. Zeffiro described how she had unsuccessfully attempted to hire several tree services to remove a dangerous tree from her property. Mayor Matthew Doebler voiced similar concerns and described a dangerous tree situation on his property. The Borough Secretary stated that in June of 2024 she and Borough Engineer requested assistance from PennDOT and Duquesne Light and both denied responsibility.

APPROVAL OF FEBRUARY 17, 2026 COUNCIL MINUTES

A motion was made by Bill Monski, seconded by Jim Cohen, to approve the Council Meeting Minutes. Council voted 7 – 0, to approve the Minutes.

APPROVAL OF MARCH 3, 2026 COMMITTEE MINUTES

A motion was made by Jim Cohen, seconded by Gary Schurman to approve the Committee Meeting Minutes. Council voted 7 – 0, to approve the Minutes.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

The Borough received \$233 from Magistrate Rosselli office for fines for the month of February.

\$3,430 was received from Allegheny County for real estate transfer tax from the sale of 1478 Grandview Way.

On March 2, 2026, the Borough received \$20,595 Liquid Fuels Tax Allocation from PennDOT for 2025. This amount is the Borough's share of the Act 655 – Liquid Fuels Act 44 Allocations.

Leo Scalercio will provide the use of his convertible for the Borough Council in the Memorial Day parade.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT

Solicitor's Representative Alex Giorgetti announced that Solicitor Jewart will meet with Council in an Executive Session at the April 7, 2026, Committee Meeting, to discuss virtual and live streaming meetings.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Jim Cohen reported that Chief Mazza agreed it would be helpful to place an additional pedestrian crosswalk sign along Beaver Road at Rabbit Hill and Orchard Lane.

PUBLIC SERVICES

President Orndorff commended Josh Lambert for his expertise in helping with the creation of a new website for the Borough. Josh Lambert provided an overview of a recent meeting held with several Council members where they explored ideas and possibilities for the new website. Josh will send schedule a training session for Council members in the near future.

PUBLIC WORKS

President Orndorff reported that the General Manager of Sewickley Water Authority, Mark Brooks, announced that the Water Authority will repave Beaver Road curb to curb, after the completion of their project this summer.

President Orndorff reviewed several options for determining ownership of the stone wall along Route 65. President Orndorff will ask our Borough Engineer to contact PennDOT and request that PennDOT handles this issue.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

Bill Monski reported that he is continuing to work on plans for an emergency battery backup at the Haysville light. President Orndorff thanked Bill Monski for his dedication and hours of service as Emergency Manager during the recent storms.

FINANCE & BILLS

A check detail was included in the packet sent to Council, Mayor, and the Solicitor. Josh Lambert motioned payment of the bills with the inclusion of invoices that are late arriving from our solicitor (Babst Calland) and Brian Brown's Property Maintenance. Bill Monski seconded the motion. Council was polled, and all voted yes to approve the motion.

There being no further business, on motion of Greg Curran, seconded by Jim Cohen, Council voted unanimously to adjourn at 8:09 p.m.
