

**GLEN OSBORNE BOROUGH
MINUTES
APRIL 21, 2026
COUNCIL MEETING**

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting of Glen Osborne Borough Council was held in Osborne Elementary School, on Tuesday, April 21, 2026. President John Orndorff called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE President Orndorff led the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MARCH 17, 2026 COUNCIL MINUTES

A motion was made by Bill Monski, seconded by Jim Cohen, to approve the Council Meeting Minutes. Council voted 6 – 0, to approve the Minutes.

APPROVAL OF APRIL 7, 2026 COMMITTEE MINUTES

A motion was made by Jim Cohen, seconded by Gary Schurman to approve the Committee Meeting Minutes. Council voted 6 – 0, to approve the Minutes.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Doebler reported that it was an honor to represent Glen Osborne at the 150th Anniversary Celebration of Cochran Hose Company (Sewickley Volunteer Fire Department) at Allegheny Country Club. He praised the outstanding service and commitment of the volunteer firefighters.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

The Borough received \$234 from Magistrate Rosselli's office for fines for the month of March.

The Borough received a dividend payment of \$1,519 from MRM Property & Liability Trust's Self-Insured Retention Program as a 2026 PLT Dividend payment for years 2020 – 2024. The Borough did not incur any losses during 2020 – 2024.

On motion of Bill Monski, seconded by Jim Cohen, Council voted 6 – 0, to adopt Resolution No. 2026-03 Opt-in Future CDBG 2027-2029 Grants.

The Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG) is funded by U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). CDBG funding is available for “non-income based” projects such as ADA accessibility improvement projects and blight remediation. Projects must total at least \$20,000 and municipalities may submit multiple applications each year for consideration. Applications are submitted through the Quaker Valley COG (QVCOG).

SOLICITOR’S REPORT

Solicitor Jewart reported that an Executive Session was held at the April 7, 2026, Committee Meeting to receive legal advice from the Solicitor and discuss pending and potential litigation.

At the request of John Orndoff, at 7:23 pm, Council recessed into Executive Session for the purpose of receiving legal guidance from the Solicitor, and to discuss matters which if disclosed, would result in the disclosure of lawful privilege. Council reconvened at 8:14 pm.

On motion of Bill Monski, seconded by Gary Schurman, Council voted 6 – 0, to establish a committee including Josh Lambert, Bill Monski, Gary Schurman and Mayor Matt Doebler, that would determine the process to meet the requirements so that the Council can move forward to live stream and video record meetings and post them on YouTube.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Property Maintenance letters will be sent to all residents of the Borough.

PUBLIC WORKS

The Solicitor will contact the Borough Engineer to determine who is responsible for cleaning storm sewers on private roads.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

On motion of Bill Monski, seconded by Jim Cohen, Council voted 6 – 0, to adopt Resolution No. 2026-04 Allegheny County 2026 Hazard Mitigation Plan.

FINANCE & BILLS


Finance Chairman Greg Curran reported that year to date, our budget is on target as planned.
