

**GLEN OSBORNE BOROUGH
MINUTES
AUGUST 18, 2026
COMMITTEE/COUNCIL MEETING**

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting of Glen Osborne Borough Council was held in Osborne Elementary School, on Tuesday, August 18, 2026. President John Orndorff called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. He announced, for transparency purposes, the meeting was being audio and video recorded and live streamed on Glen Osborne Borough's official YouTube channel.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE President Orndorff led the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF JULY 21, 2026 COMMITTEE/COUNCIL MINUTES

A motion was made by Jim Cohen, seconded by Greg Curran, to approve the Council Meeting Minutes. Council voted 6 – 0, to approve the Minutes.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Diane Vierling was pleased to report that Allegheny County repaired the Davis Lane bridge guide rail. President Orndorff asked Josh Lambert to contact Brian Brown and determine the cost to replace two ornamental trees that were destroyed during the Memorial Day storm when a tree fell and damaged the guide rail.

The Borough received \$237 from Magistrate Rosselli's office for fines for the month of July.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT

At 7:14 p.m., John Orndorff requested an Executive Session for the purpose of discussion of potential litigation and to receive legal guidance from the Solicitor. Council reconvened at 8:29 p.m.

PUBLIC SAFETY

In accordance with the Borough's ordinance, Jim Cohen reported that Brian Brown will be

replacing the Permit Parking Only signs along Railroad Avenue and Center Street with Resident Parking Only signs.

President Orndorff stated Council is considering asking Police Chief Mazza to attend the September Council meeting. At Mayor Doeblen's recommendation, President Orndorff invited residents to contact him or any Council member or the Borough Secretary with their questions or concerns about police services.

PUBLIC SERVICES

On motion of Josh Lambert, seconded by Bill Monski, Council voted 6 - 0, to adopt Website Policy Resolution No. 2026-08 designating Diane Vierling as the administrator of the Borough's website. On motion of John Orndorff, seconded by Josh Lambert, Council voted 6 - 0, to designate President Orndorff and Bill Monski, as emergency administrators of the website.

Council authorized Diane Vierling to send letters to Academy Place residents, advising them of their responsibility to maintain the storm sewers on their private road.

PUBLIC WORKS

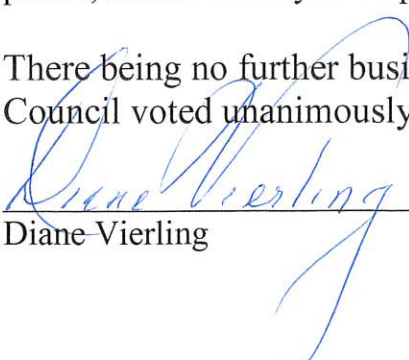
Solicitor Jewart reported that the price for road rock salt has nearly doubled since last year. Only one bid, \$160 per ton, was received by SHACOG. QVCOG plans to solicit a new bid. Solicitor Jewart will keep Council updated. Council has until October 10, 2026, to place an order for salt through SHACOG. Therefore, no action was taken at this time. Council will further discuss this matter at their October 6, 2026, Committee Meeting.

Borough Engineer Clint Reilly reported that two dangerous trees need to be removed. President Orndorff directed Diane Vierling to ask Clint Reilly to notify the property owner of 1501 Beaver Road to remove their dangerous tree, and to contact Tall Timber to remove the tree located, within the Borough's right-of-way, adjacent to the Sycamore Road ramp.

FINANCE & BILLS

Greg Curran motioned payment of the bills, Jim Cohen seconded the motion. Council was polled, and all voted yes to approve the motion.

There being no further business, on motion of Jim Cohen, seconded by Bill Monski, Council voted unanimously to adjourn at 8:51 p.m.
